Starting in the 1970s, artists began to occupy the industrial wasteland of SoHo and transform it into a thriving cultural hub. The void left by the desolate space allowed artists to explore new ways to create art, and SoHo began its slow climb back into popularity. Inexpensive, open lofts became vibrant living communities and working spaces. Today the bustling streets and upscale shops cover the past almost entirely.
